Bridgnorth Site Reaches Completion

Walkhamwood Farm, Bridgnorth

Work at Stephen Mottershead's broiler site has now drawn to a close for the Knights team. The most recently completed tasks included the formation of external concrete aprons and the internal floor of the Biomass centre.

A number of sub-contractors are still on site as feed and ventilation systems are being gradually commissioned.

Due to certain planning stipulations, the formation level for this project had to be far lower than the surrounding land. This resulted in extremely large-scale groundworks and the sculpting of landscaped bunds (as seen in the photos).

Did you know...

During the first four decades of the modern Olympic Games, 151 medals were awarded for music, painting, sculpture, literature, and architecture.

French postman Ferdinand Cheval spent 33 years picking up stones while delivering mail. With these stones he built the fantastical Le Palais Idéal in Hauterives. The building is considered a prime example of naïve art, and in 1969 was designated a cultural landmark.

Our teams are now finishing up on the site drainage installation and are underway with stoning up the sub-base.

Once completed, this site will eventually be home to a twelve-unit turkey rearing facility with bio-security being a focus.

Aviagen operates full-scale breeding programmes in the USA and Europe and supply to both customers and distributors.


