Following the demolition of an unstable section of the building, an ancient well that has not been seen for what could be a century or more was discovered by our team. After consultations with the customer, plans for an alteration to the design were put forward and the well is now due to be featured prominently within a new extension to the rear.

Second Job at AD Plant Shows Steady Progress CURRENT

Following the successful delivery of a new silage clamp for AD plant customers, Biogas earlier in the year, Knights were recently charged with delivering a second.

Progress has been steady at the site in Whitchurch, with the foundations, pre-cast vertical concrete panels and drainage systems all now installed.

Next to be installed is the concrete clamp floor and 15-metre concrete apron with the whole project due to be completed by mid-December.

Our Bobcat T770 laser-grader has been in action for the trimming of the MOT before the concrete slabs will be poured.

Concrete will be 170mm thick with a layer of A193 mesh and texture-finished.


Northwich Lake Takes Shape

Operations Manager Takes On Isle of Man Rally


